Our mission is to grow the city's economy in an inclusive manner by retaining, expanding and attracting businesses and promoting investment, thereby increasing career opportunities for residents.

• BDC is committed to a more equitable economy by supporting minority and women-owned businesses and promoting investment in neighborhoods that have been negatively impacted by institutional racism and generational poverty. We develop strategies and facilitate collaboration among our partners to intentionally create an inclusive and equitable economy.



• BDC also administers two non-profit organizations, the <u>Emerging Technology Centers</u> & <u>Made in Baltimore</u>.








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The four main components of the **Response and Recovery Plan**:



**Ensuring inclusion & equity has been a priority.** 



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**Major Economic Impacts:** 

- Approximately 19,000 jobs lost in 2020.
- Most negatively impacted businesses were restaurants, hotels, gyms. Positive growth in warehousing and biotech R&D.
- BIPOC-owned businesses were less likely to received federal and state assistance according to BDC's surveys.



- Over 2,200 small businesses assisted.
- Over \$19 million in small business assistance will be provided through BDC by the end of June 2021.
- D4D projects in 16 neighborhood commercial districts.



# **OUTREACH:**

- Launched an online survey immediately with over 700 responses.
- Each survey participant was contacted by phone as a follow up.
- BDC mapped the outreach to ensure equitable coverage across the city and identifying areas that may need more direct outreach.

## **INFORMATION:**

- Launched a new Baltimore Together website with over 26,000 visits.
- Conducted a webinar with state and federal leaders with over 1,400 participants.
- 64% increase in BDC's website traffic.

## **COLLABORATION:**

- BDC is leading a network of 19 organizations to provide outreach and technical assistance.
- Working with partners to provide language assistance.
- Working with City government on policies to support reopening.
- · Working with state and federal partners.
- Part of Bloomberg Cohort for recovery.

## **ACTION:**

- Over **\$19 million for business** recovery.
- \$550,000 Local Manufacturing for **Personal Protective Equipment** (PPE)
- \$1.5 million for Design for Distancing initiative to reconfigure 16 commercial districts.
- \$17 million for small business assistance grants with over 1,200 awarded. 63% to MBEs.



- Ads were placed in the Afro.



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


Ellis said the expertise that BDC offered through its technical assistance network also made a huge difference for her and others who might have no background in business management before opening:

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

#### **ACTION: Small Business Grants**

- \$17 million for small business assistance grants
- Over 1,200 grants awarded to date.
- 4 rounds of grants completed with a 5<sup>th</sup> round pending for restaurants.
- Based on need, not first come first serve.
- Equitably distributed; nationally recognized approach.







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# Baltimore Development Corp. tries to close the gap for Black-owned businesses

Baltimore's economic development head says the city did everything it could to help Blackowned businesses deal with the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic despite having a limited amount of money to provide.

The quasi-governmental Baltimore Development Corp. took several actions to try and buck a national trend as Black-owned businesses have been disproportionately impacted by the pandemic compared to their white counterparts. Research has also shown they have lacked the same access to

The city provided \$3.5 million in grants to assist businesses affected by Covid-19 and has also partnered with a number of organizations to create a technical assistance network.

critical funding lifelines like the federal government's Paycheck Protection Program.

Among those steps, the BDC established a \$3.5 million small business assistance fund to provide grants. The fund awarded 368 grants, with 74% going to minorityowned businesses and 68% to women-owned businesses. Nearly 30% of the grants went to Black-owned businesses, despite just 10% of businesses in the city being Black-owned, according to the BDC. The average grant was about \$10,000.


Colin Tarbert, CEO of the BDC, said he waited longer than other cities to begin distributing the grants because he wanted to ensure the city took an equitable approach.



- 63% of grants awarded to businesses owned by people of color.
- 57% of grants awarded to women-owned businesses.
- 66% of grants awarded to city-resident owned businesses.











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#### **CEDS Activity By The Numbers** November 2019 – April 2021



# **CEDS Process & Timeline**



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
