9 10	WHEREAS, Baltimore is a Welcoming City where immigrants of diverse racial, ethnic, and religious backgrounds are welcome to live, work, learn, play, and thrive;
11 12	WHEREAS, Baltimore's immigrant community members are essential workers, taxpayers, and contributors to our neighborhoods;
13 14	WHEREAS, Baltimore is home to 11,000 immigrants, who live across our City and contribute to our local economy and community;
15 16 17	WHEREAS , immigrant communities in Baltimore and across the country suffered greatly from COVID-19 and yet were ineligible for several aid programs and insurance, even though they are tax-paying residents;
18 19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, immigrant essential workers in our City have been critical to our City during the COVID-19 pandemic, filing critical roles in our health care and education sectors and serving as "frontline" workers in our food security, public safety, transportation, and critical infrastructure systems to continue to serve all of our residents and providing critical services and care during the COVID-19 pandemic;

WHEREAS, granting a pathway to citizenship for these valuable contributors to our
 community and economy would result in increased economic output, average wages, and
 increased productivity; and
