ANALYSIS

The resolution invites the Department of Public Works, Department of Housing and Community Development, Law Department, Health Department, and Police Department to explain how their agencies assist in solving the problem of illegal dumping in the City. Specifically, the resolution calls for the agencies to address:

- What limitations and challenges hamper the Department of Public Works' (DPW) and the Department of Housing and Community Development's (DHCD) responses to illegal dumping;
- What additional functions and particular staff DPW and DHCD need to increase their efficiency in responding to illegal dumping;
- The role technology currently plays in responding to illegal dumping and what opportunities there are to pursue newer, more capable technology;
- How DPW and DHCD use data analysis to find areas that are the frequent targets of illegal dumping;
- The importance of a renewed educational campaign and communication strategy regarding littering and illegal dumping, and the role of each agency in promoting this campaign;
- What avenues are worth exploring to increase cooperation between DPW and DHCD and any other agencies that are involved in solving the problem of illegal dumping, such as the Law Department and the Health Department;
- An overview of the City and State laws that address illegal dumping; and
- The impact of illegal dumping on public safety and criminal activity.
