Background

This Ordinance proposes a tax rate of \$2.248 on every \$100 of assessed or assessable real property in Baltimore City and a tax of \$5.62 levied on every \$100 of assessed or assessable value of:



- 1. Personal property; and
- 2. Operating real property as described in the State Tax Property Article Section 8 109C.

The proposed tax rate is the same as proposed in fiscal year 2021.

Per State law, <u>the Constant Yield Tax Rate for Baltimore City for fiscal year 2021/2022</u> must be advertised. As required, <u>the advertisement</u> was placed in the Baltimore Sun newspaper on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>May 15, 2021</u>. A copy of the ad is attached.

This hearing is also referred to as "Taxpayers' Night."

Taxpayers' Night provide the residents of Baltimore City the opportunity to share comments and concerns about the City's budget.

Note: The Committee/Council members <u>listen to the speakers/citizens</u> **but** <u>do not answer and/or</u> <u>respond to questions or comments during the hearing</u>.

BALTIMORE CITY NOTICE OF PROPOSED REAL PROPERTY TAX INCREASE

The City Council of Baltimore City proposes to increase real property taxes.

1. For the tax year beginning July 1, 2021, the estimated real property assessable base will increase by 0.66% from \$39,798,368,941 to \$40,059,137,565.

2. If Baltimore City maintains the current tax rate of \$2.248 per \$100 of assessment, real property tax revenues will increase by 0.66% resulting in \$5,862,079 of new real property tax revenues.

3. In order to fully offset the effect of increasing assessments, the real property tax rate should be reduced to \$2.2334, the constant yield tax rate.

4. The City is considering not reducing its real property tax rate enough to fully offset increasing assessments. The City proposes to adopt a real property tax rate of \$2.248 per \$100 of assessment. This tax rate is 0.66% higher than the constant yield tax rate and will generate \$5,862,079 in additional property tax revenues.

A public hearing on the proposed real property tax rate increase will be held on Thursday, May 27, 2021 at 5:00 P.M. The hearing will be held remotely via video and audio teleconference. 6 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That for 7 the period July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, a tax is levied and imposed for the use of the 8 Mayor and City Council of Baltimore on all property in the City of Baltimore (except property 9 exempt by law), as follows:

- (a) except as otherwise specified in item (b) of this section, a tax of \$2.248 is levied and
 imposed on every \$100 of assessed or assessable value of real property; and
- 12 (b) a tax of \$5.62 is levied and imposed on every \$100 of assessed or assessable value of:
- 13 (1) personal property; and
 - (2) operating real property described in State Tax-Property Article § 8-109(c).

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this tax shall be paid and collected in the
 manner prescribed by law including the provisions of Section 10-210 of the Tax-Property Article
 of the Annotated Code of the Public General Laws of Maryland.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That for the period July 1, 2021, through June
 30, 2022, the semiannual payment service charge to be imposed under State Tax-Property Article
 § 10-204.3 is 0.09%.

21 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is 22 enacted.
