**INTRODUCTION** – Urban Renewal - Canton Industrial Area - Amendment

**PURPOSE/PLANS** – For the purpose of amending the Urban Renewal Plan for the Canton Industrial Area to revise the boundary of the Plan to remove a certain property; replacing certain exhibits to reflect the change; waiving certain content and procedural requirements; making the provisions of this Ordinance severable; providing for the application of this Ordinance in conjunction with certain other ordinances; and providing for a special effective date.

**COMMENTS** – Council Bill 21-0056 is a companion bill to Council Bill 21-0051. The legislation looks to remove 4900 Boston Street from the existing Urban Renewal - Canton Industrial Area. The statement of intent for Council Bill 21-0051 provides notice of the property owner’s plan build a drive-thru restaurant at the location upon being rezoned. In the event a drive-thru restaurant would be pursued, DOT staff would evaluate plans during the project’s Site Plan Review.

**AGENCY/DEPARTMENT POSITION** – The Department of Transportation foresees no direct fiscal or operational impact resulting from the advancement of Council Bill 21-0056. The Department of Transportation has **no objection** to Council Bill 21-0056.
