3	121.10.5 FAILURE TO SELL. A RECEIVER APPOINTED TO SELL A VACANT BUILDING MAY
4	OFFER THE PROPERTY FOR SALE TO THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE CITY,
5	IF THE PROPERTY FAILS TO SELL AT PUBLIC AUCTION HELD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
6	PROVISIONS THAT APPLY TO A RECEIVER APPOINTED UNDER RULE 3-722 {"RECEIVERS"}
7	AND TITLE 14, CHAPTER 300 {"JUDICIAL SALES"} OF THE MARYLAND RULES. THE SALE
8	PRICE SHALL NOT EXCEED THE RECEIVER'S EXPENSES IN PREPARING THE PROPERTY FOR
