#### **Major Issues Discussed**

- President Mosby gave opening remarks and informed the attendees about the guidelines pertaining
  to questions for BCPS staff. He said, it's been a very trying time due to COVID. Our students
  received virtual learning for over one and one-half years and are just returning to school inperson. He also talked about some of the recent commendations/citations presented to several
  BCPS staff members.
- 2. Several representatives on behalf of <u>Baltimore City Public Schools</u> testified. Some highlights of their discussion were:
  - Ms. Richardson introduced the members and staff for the Board of School Commissioners and gave opening remarks. She talked about how COVID-19 affected teaching and about some of the challenges associated with same; present and past challenges.
  - <u>Dr. Santelises along with other BCPS staff</u> gave a PowerPoint presentation, entitled "School Performance Improvement." *A copy is on file*.
- 3. The committee/councilmembers asked questions, stated concerns, and asked for clarification for some issues. Some highlights from same were:

    - How does a student(s) keep up with his/her learning when quarantined due to COVID?
    - Organizational Excellence What does this work look like?
    - What are some of the "lessons learned" as a result of the pandemic?
    - Can you share the matrixes you used for your acceleration model (located on page 18 of the Presentation)? Per CEO Santelises will forward the study to the committee
    - Talk a little more about how you are addressing issues surrounding mental health
    - Explain the processes in place when schools do not follow the appropriate CDC health and safety guidelines.
    - What are the characteristics of the individualized learning plan(s)?
    - Level of trauma how does it tie into the learning plans? And how do teachers know (the red flags) how to initiate the next step/process?
