Analysis

Current Law

Baltimore City Code – Article 1, Subtitle 1-City Council, Section 1-6

§ 1-6. Agencies to provide legislative information.

It shall be the duty of the head of every City department or bureau established by the Baltimore City Charter or by ordinance to provide all technical materials, plats, drawings, and information that are requested by any member or the President of the City Council for the purpose of introducing legislation into the Council. (City Code, 1976/83, art. 1, §6.) (Ord. 76-080.)

Baltimore City Charter – Article VII, Subsections 59 through 64 – Department of Education – outlines the rules, regulations and mandates for Baltimore City Public Schools.

Background

Per the primary, "This Resolution came about as a result of some high school constituents who have a strong opinion about school lunches. The hearing will give constituents the opportunity to voice their opinions about school lunches."

On Thursday, October 21, 2021, constituents, representatives from the Baltimore City Public School System (BCPS) and other pertinent BCPS staff will come before the committee to discuss public school lunches.
