JOURNAL APPROVED

The Journal of January 11, 2016 was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION AND READ FIRST TIME

The President laid before the City Council the following bills and Resolutions of the Mayor and City Council for first reading:

Bill No. 16-0620 - By Councilmembers Costello, Stokes:

A Resolution of the Mayor and City Council renewing and continuing the Midtown Community Benefits District and Management Authority; providing for a special effective date; and generally relating to the activities and authority of the Midtown Community Benefits District and Management Authority.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Department of Planning, Baltimore Development Corporation, Department of Public Works, Department of Housing and Community Development, Department of Transportation, Board of Estimates, Urban Affairs and Aging Committee.

Bill No. 16-0621 - By President Young, Councilmembers Kraft, Middleton, Costello, Scott, Stokes, Curran, Branch, Henry, Welch, Spector, Reisinger, Clarke, Mosby (by request):

An Ordinance requiring the City to conduct a health impacts assessment and a risk assessment of the transport of crude oil by rail; requiring the City to update, periodically study, and report on the City's incident response plans as they relate to the transport of crude oil by rail; requiring the City to create a mechanism to ensure proper clean up and effective response to derailments or other adverse impacts; requiring the City to develop certain public outreach programs; and providing for a special effective date.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Health Department, Department of Finance, Judiciary and Legislative Investigations Committee.

The President laid before the City Council the following Council Resolutions for first reading:

Bill No. 16-0283R - By Councilmembers Spector, Clarke, President Young, Councilmembers Kraft, Middleton, Costello, Scott, Stokes, Curran, Branch, Henry, Welch, Reisinger, Mosby:

A Resolution calling on representatives from Baltimore Rising, the Citizens Planning and Housing Association, the Community Law Center, One Baltimore, the Department of Housing and Community Development, the Baltimore Development Corporation, and the Department of Planning to join the City Council and representatives from two of Baltimore's community associations – the Glen Neighborhood Improvement Association and the Howard Park Civic Association – to discuss how to coordinate efforts to use new and tried tools to advance community based job opportunities concurrently with improvements to housing stock, buildings, and open spaces in Baltimore's neighborhoods.

A COUNCIL RESOLUTION CONCERNING

**Approving the Submission of an Application to the U.S. Department of
Housing and Urban Development for the Designation of a Promise Zone**

FOR the purpose of approving the submission of an application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for designation in Baltimore City of an area, which is generally bounded by West North Avenue to the north, Carroll Camden Industrial Park to the south, North Charles Street to the east, and South Monroe Street / Mulberry Street / North Bentalou Street / West Lafayette Street / North Monroe Street to the west, as a Promise Zone under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Promise Zones Initiative; and providing for a special effective date.

Recitals

WHEREAS, In 2013, President Obama laid out an initiative to help the federal government partner with local governments and other organizations to create jobs, leverage private investment, increase economic activity, expand educational opportunities, and improve public safety in high-poverty communities that met certain criteria.

WHEREAS, The Promise Zones Initiative provides for Promise Zones to be designated in urban and rural areas, that there will be a maximum designation of 20 Promise Zones, and that the designations will be awarded on a competitive basis.

WHEREAS, Designation as a Promise Zone does not provide accompanying grant funding, but it does provide preferences for certain competitive federal programs and technical assistance from participating agencies, a federal liaison to assist with navigating federal programs, the opportunity to engage 5 AmeriCorps Vista members, and Promise Zone tax incentives, if enacted by Congress.

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development has announced a third and final round of application for communities to be designated as Promise Zones.

WHEREAS, Baltimore City and its partners have been working on an application, which includes goals, outcomes, and strategies to pursue community revitalization efforts, for submission to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Promise Zones Initiative to have an area of the City designated as a Promise Zone.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the City of Baltimore:

- (1) approves the designation of the area bounded by West North Avenue to the north, Carroll Camden Industrial Park to the south, North Charles Street to the east, and South Monroe Street / Mulberry Street / North Bentalou Street / West Lafayette Street / North Monroe Street to the west as a Promise Zone under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Promise Zones Initiative.
- (2) approves the submission of an application to designate the area as a Promise Zone and authorizes and directs the appropriate City officials and other partner agencies that are participating in the designation to execute and submit the application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this Resolution be sent to the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and to the Baltimore City Housing Commissioner.

AND ORDERED PRINTED FOR THIRD READING**

Councilmember Kraft, for the Budget and Appropriations Committee, reported Bill No. 15-0605 favorably.

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$54,000 to the Health Department – Service 716 (Animal Services), to provide funding to support half the cost of a full-time veterinarian position at BARCS; and providing for a special effective date.

Favorable report adopted.

**BILL NO. 15-0606 REPORTED FAVORABLY

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$500,000 to the Miscellaneous General Expenses – Service 122 (Miscellaneous General Expenses), to provide funding for settlement of residents' claims as a result of the collapse of a portion of East 26th Street in April 2014; and providing for a special effective date.

Favorable report adopted.

**BILL NO. 15-0608 REPORTED FAVORABLY, WITH AMENDMENTS THAT WERE NOT
PLACED BEFORE THE COUNCIL, AND ORDERED PRINTED FOR THIRD READING**

Councilmember Kraft, for the Budget and Appropriations Committee, reported Bill No. 15-0608 favorably, with amendments adopted by the Committee.

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$500,000 to the Department of Planning – Service 761 (Development Oversight and Project Support), to provide funding for community greening projects in targeted neighborhoods throughout the City; and providing for a special effective date.

Councilmember Kraft, for the Budget and Appropriations Committee, reported Bill No. 15-0609 favorably.

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$346,923 to the Police Department – Service 642 (Crime Laboratory), to provide funding for 10 new contractual Police Department Crime Lab positions in Fiscal 2016 (\$246,923) and for new equipment and supplies needed for evidence processing (\$100,000); and providing for a special effective date.

Favorable report adopted, with President Young Passing.

**BILL NO. 15-0587 REPORTED FAVORABLY, WITH AN AMENDMENT,
AND ORDERED PRINTED FOR THIRD READING**

Councilmember Stokes, for the Taxation, Finance and Economic Development Committee, reported Bill No. 15-0587 favorably, with an amendment.

An Ordinance authorizing the issuance of special obligation bonds; authorizing the pledge by the City, subject to appropriation, of Tax Increment Revenues and Special Tax Revenues (as such terms are defined herein) to the payment of debt service on such special obligation bonds, the replenishment of any reserves, and the payment of certain expenses and administrative costs; providing that such bonds may be issued from time to time and in one or more issues or series in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$17,500,000 for the purpose of financing infrastructure improvements and related costs, including, without limitation, the Project (defined herein), and other necessary improvements to, from, or within the development district, and certain other infrastructure improvements permitted by the Acts (defined herein); providing for the method and sources of payment for such special obligation bonds; providing that the City, in each fiscal year in which any such bonds are outstanding, use its best efforts to obtain the appropriation of the Tax Increment Revenues and the Special Tax Revenues in the amounts and at the times specified in a trust agreement or agreements between the City and a bank or trust

company appointed as trustee thereunder; authorizing the Board of Finance to specify, prescribe, determine, provide for and approve the details, forms, documents or procedures in connection with such special obligation bonds and any other matters necessary or desirable in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale, and payment of such special obligation bonds; providing for a special effective date; and generally relating to the issuance and payment of such special obligation bonds.
