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**ELECTION OF A NEW CITY COUNCILMEMBER**

Councilmember Sneed declared that the Committee found that Danielle McCray possessed the necessary qualifications prescribed by the Charter. The nomination was seconded by Councilmember Cohen.

Dear Council Members:

I am pleased to inform your Honorable Body that I have signed into law this day these bills which are routine and require no special treatment:

**Bill 18-0298** - An Ordinance concerning - Franchise – 26" OHP Gas Main (Granite Pipeline) Through the Lands of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore - For the purpose of granting a franchise 50' wide to the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company (i) to construct, use, and maintain a new 26" OHP Gas Main (Granite Pipeline); and (ii) to decommission and maintain an existing 26" OHP Gas Main (Granite Pipeline), both running through “Gwynns Falls Leakin Park”, owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore located in Baltimore City, Maryland, subject to certain terms, conditions, and reservations; and providing for a special effective date.

**Bill 19-0357** - An Ordinance concerning - Fire and Police Employees’ Retirement System – Interest, Service Credits, Death Benefits, Direct Deposit, and Technical Corrections - For the purpose of repealing certain obsolete and obsolescent provisions; changing the definition of regular interest for valuation purposes; clarifying the crediting of military service under certain circumstances; modifying the calculation of the cost of purchasing and transferring prior system service, non-credited City service, former Maryland Police Corps service, and service earned for employment covered under a former non-City pension; expanding the definition of “minor child” for certain purposes; allowing certain spousal beneficiaries age 70 and over to remarry without penalty of losing benefits; allowing new beneficiary elections and survivorship option elections within certain time periods; requiring that, after a certain date and subject to certain exceptions, periodic benefit payments be made electronically; defining certain terms; providing for special effective dates; and generally relating to the Baltimore City Fire and Police Employees’ Retirement System.

An Ordinance providing the appropriations estimated to be needed by each agency of the City of Baltimore for operating programs and capital projects during the Fiscal 2020 year.

**BILL NO. 19-0391 REPORTED FAVORABLY  
AND ORDERED PRINTED FOR THIRD READING**

Councilmember Costello, for the Budget and Appropriations Committee, reported Bill No. 19-0391 favorably.

An Ordinance providing a Supplementary State Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$2,214,357 to the Police Department - Service 621 (Administration and Information Technology), to provide funding to support information technology upgrades, a critical step in modernizing the Department and meeting requirements of the Consent Decree with the U.S. Department of Justice; and providing for a special effective date.

Favorable report adopted, with Councilmember Dorsey voting Nay.

**BILL NO. 18-0302 REPORTED FAVORABLY, WITH AMENDMENTS,  
AND ORDERED PRINTED FOR THIRD READING**

Councilmember Costello, for the Judiciary and Legislative Investigations Committee, reported Bill No. 18-0302 favorably, with amendments.

An Ordinance deleting an exception for the sale of motor vehicle fuels; authorizing the issuance of a conditional license for certain delivery services; and generally related to the licensing of late-night commercial operations.
