For the purpose of eliminating off-street parking requirements for a residential project that is subject to inclusionary housing requirements.

By repealing and re-ordaining, with amendments

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 32. Zoning

Title 16. Off-Street Parking and Loading

Subtitle 6. Required Off-Street Parking

§ 16-601. Exemptions and reductions from requirements.

(g) Reductions - Affordable housing.

(1) *In general.*

- (i) No more than 1 parking space need be provided for every 2 dwelling units in dwellings that are erected or rehabilitated subject to a restriction that the units be leased to residents with incomes at or below 60% of the Area Median Income, with that restriction being for a term of not less than 15 years from the date of the issuance of a use permit and recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore City.
- (ii) The Housing Commissioner must verify, by letter to the Planning Director and the Zoning Administrator, the recordation, term, and tenor of the restriction.

(2) *Residential projects subject to inclusionary requirements.*

Off-street parking is not required for a residential project that is subject to the inclusionary

requirements under § 2B-21 {"Inclusionary requirements"} of Article 13 of this Code.

Section 2. And be it further ordained, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after the date it is enacted.
