CITY OF BALTIMORE COUNCIL BILL

A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE concerning **Sanitary Maintenance - Penalties**

FOR the purpose of increasing the prepayable citation penalties for certain sanitary maintenance offenses; and correcting certain cross-references to those offenses.

BY repealing and reordaining, with amendments Article 1 - Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies Section(s) 40-14(e)(6a) Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000)

BY repealing and reordaining, with amendments Article 19 - Police Ordinances Section(s) 71-2(i)(2) Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000)

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:
