A COUNCIL RESOLUTION concerning

FOR the purpose of celebrating Women's History Month, recognizing the extraordinary accomplishments of women, honoring their role in the shaping of our families, our City, our State and our Nation, and endorsing the theme, Our History is Our Strength, that honors women within local communities and organizations.

Recitals

March was designated as National Women's History Month by Joint Resolutions of the House and Senate and Proclamations by six American Presidents and is celebrated in thousands of schools, communities, and workplaces across the nation as well as on military bases throughout the world.

Each year National Women's History Month employs a unifying theme that honors women around the country whose work and lives testify to that theme. Our History is Our Strength, the 2011 theme, invites local communities, organizations, and institutions to honor women within their own communities and organizations.

In proclaiming this years Women's History Month, the President of the United States remarked "During Women's History Month, we reflect on the extraordinary accomplishments of women and honor their role in shaping the course of our Nation's history. Today women have reached heights their mothers and grandmothers might only have imagined. Women now comprise nearly half of our work force and the majority of students in our colleges and universities.
