A Bill Entitled

An Ordinance concerning

Director of Public Works - Failure to Provide Required Weekly Collection Services

For the purpose of creating a penalty to apply to the Director of Public Works if the Director does not provide for the collection and removal of mixed refuse and recyclable materials on a weekly basis.

By repealing and reordaining, with amendments,

Article 23 - Sanitation

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 23. Sanitation

Subtitle 1. Definitions; General Provisions

§ 1-4. Public Works to provide sanitation services.

(a) *In general.*

The Director of Public Works has charge of the following services, as authorized or required to be done by the City:

- (1) the cleaning of the public streets, lanes, and alleys; and
- (2) the collection and removal of mixed refuse and recyclable materials.

(b) *Collection frequency.*

(1) *In general.*

For premises that receive collection services, the Director of Public Works shall provide for:

- (i) [(1)] the collection of mixed refuse once a week; and
- (ii) [(2)] the collection of recyclable materials once a week.

(2) *Failure to provide for collection services.*

If the Director of Public Works fails to meet the provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection, the Director of Public Works is subject to a fine of \$1,000.

(3) *Each day a separate offense.*

Each day that a violation continues is a separate offense.

Section 2. And be it further ordained, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after the date it is enacted.
