**Commercial Vehicle Monitoring System**

For the purpose of modifying the maximum number of operational cameras authorized to enforce Baltimore City's commercial vehicle monitoring system.

By repealing and reordaining with amendments

Article 31 - Transit and Traffic  
Section(s) 34-3(b)

**Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,** That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

**Baltimore City Code**

**Article 31. Transit and Traffic**

**Subtitle 34. Commercial Vehicle Monitoring System**

**§ 34-3. Governing standards, etc.**

(b) *Maximum number of operational cameras.*

No more than [6] 16 cameras may be operational at any one time.

**Section 2. And be it further ordained,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day after the date it is enacted.
