A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE concerning  
**Baltimore City Landmark List - Olmsted Parkways**

FOR the purpose of designating the Olmsted Parkways, which consist of the public right-of-way of the 2600-3200 blocks of the Alameda, the public right-of-way of the 0000-1800 blocks of 33rd Street, and the public right-of-way of the 1600-3900 blocks of the Gwynns Falls Parkway, as a historical landmark.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 6. Historical and Architectural Preservation

Subtitle 13. Landmark List - 2010s

§ 13-35. OLMSTED PARKWAYS.

- (A) THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY OF THE 2600-3200 BLOCKS OF THE ALAMEDA;
- (B) THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY OF THE 0000-1800 BLOCKS OF 33RD STREET; AND
- (C) THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY OF THE 1600-3900 BLOCKS OF THE GWYNNNS FALLS PARKWAY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after the date it is enacted.
