A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE concerning

Baltimore Day

FOR the purpose of declaring August 8 of each year to be Baltimore Day; requiring the Mayor to proclaim Baltimore Day on August 8 of each year; and providing for a special effective date.

BY adding

Article 1 - Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies

Section(s) 36-1, to be under the new subtitle,

Subtitle 36. Commemorative Days

Baltimore City Code

(Edition 2000)

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 1. Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies

SUBTITLE 36. COMMEMORATIVE DAYS

36~~1~~. BALTIMORE DAY.

AUGUST 8 OF EACH YEAR SHALL BE BALTIMORE DAY IN HONOR OF BALTIMORES FOUNDING ON AUGUST 8, 1729. THE MAYOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM THIS DAY AS BALTIMORE DAY, TO RECOGNIZE THIS IMPORTANT MOMENT IN THE CITY'S HISTORY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect when it is enacted.
