An outstanding athlete, Ray Glasgow has served as a longpole defenseman in lacrosse and a linebacker on the football team for Baltimore City College. He was promoted to lacrosse team captain in only his second season.

According to lacrosse coach Anthony “Merc” Ryan, “Ray got the boys ignited. He got a fire under them. You see the enthusiasm he had for it all.”

One of Baltimore’s “Key Players to Watch” in every aspect of his young life, Ray has been a smart student who earned good grades at Baltimore City College and a beloved son, helping out at his father’s painting company, Glasgow Professional Painting.

That special life, the inspiring life of Ray Glasgow, was cruelly snuffed out on Saturday, May 5, and lost to his loving family and friends, and to Baltimore’s future.
