An Ordinance concerning

Supplementary Federal Fund Operating Appropriation - Health Department - \$1,059,448

For the purpose of providing a Supplementary Federal Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$1,059,448 to the Health Department - Service 720 (HIV Treatment Services), to provide funding for a demonstration project for HIV/STD prevention programs to help implement a systems-wide organizational trauma-informed approach and cultural shift to support client health and well-being; and providing for a special effective date.

By authority of

Article VI - Board of Estimates Section 8(b)(2) and (c) Baltimore City Charter (1996 Edition)

Recitals

The revenue appropriated by this Ordinance represents a grant from the Centers for Disease Control in excess of the revenue relied on by the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the budget for Fiscal Year 2018.

That grant could not have been expected with reasonable certainty when the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2018 was formulated.

On April 4, 2018, the Board of Estimates recommended this appropriation to the City Council.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That \$1,059,448 shall be made available to the Health Department - Service 720 (HIV Treatment Services) as a Supplementary Federal Fund Operating Appropriation for Fiscal Year 2018, to provide funding for a demonstration project for HIV/STD prevention programs to help implement a systems-wide organizational trauma-informed approach and cultural shift to support client health and well-being. The source of revenue for this appropriation is a grant from the Centers for Disease Control in excess of the amount from this source that was relied on by the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the budget for Fiscal Year 2018.

Section 2. And be it further ordained, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
