## A Bill Entitled

An Ordinance concerning

#### Building Code - Permit Exemption for Shed, Etc. Construction

For the purpose of adopting a provision of the International Building Code exempting certain one story detached accessory structures used as tool and storage sheds, playhouses and similar uses from construction permitting requirements; and conforming related provisions.

By repealing and re-ordaining, with amendments Article - Building, Fire, and Related Codes Section(s) 2-103 (IBC § 105.2) Baltimore City Revised Code (2018 Edition)

**Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore**, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

#### **Baltimore City Revised Code**

#### Article - Building, Fire, and Related Codes

#### Part II. International Building Code

#### § 2-103. City modifications.

The additions, deletions, amendments, and other modifications adopted by the City are as follows:

**105.2 Work exempt from permit.** An exemption from the permit requirements of this Code does not authorize any work to be done in a manner that violates a provision of this Code or of any other law. Permits are not required for the following:

#### **Building:**

- [1. to 4. *{Not Adopted}*]
- 1. {As in IBC}

**Drafter's note:** By adopting this IBC provision, the City would be exempting work on "[o]ne story detached accessory structures used as tool and storage sheds, playhouses and similar uses, provided that the floor area is not greater than 120 square feet (11 m<sup>2</sup>)" from permitting requirements.
