CITY OF BALTIMORE COUNCIL BILL

A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE concerning

Sale of Properties - Former Beds of Certain Streets and Alleys or Portions of Them

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in certain parcels of land known as the former beds of certain streets and alleys or portions of them bounded by North Avenue, Warwick Avenue, Baker Street, and the CSX Transportation, Inc., Railroad Right of Way and no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date.

BY authority of Article V - Comptroller Section 5(b) Baltimore City Charter (1996 Edition)

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That, in accordance with Article V, § 5(b) of the City Charter, the City Comptroller may sell, at either public or private sale, all the interest of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore in certain parcels of land known as the former beds of certain streets and alleys or portions of them bounded by North Avenue, Warwick Avenue, Baker Street, and the CSX Transportation, Inc., Railroad Right of Way, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the south side of North Avenue, 100 feet wide, and the east side of the former bed of Thomas Avenue, 66 feet wide, and running thence binding on the east side of the former bed of said Thomas Avenue, Southerly 1071.8 feet, more or less, to intersect the north side of Baker Street, 66 feet wide; thence binding on the north side of said Baker Street, Westerly 66.0 feet to intersect the west side of the former bed of said Thomas Avenue; thence binding on the west side of the former bed of said Thomas Avenue, Northerly 1071.8 feet, more or less, to intersect the south side of said North Avenue, and thence binding on the south side of said North Avenue, Easterly 66.0 feet to the place of beginning.

Beginning for Parcel No. 2 at the point formed by the intersection of the west side of the former bed of Thomas Avenue, 66 feet wide, and the south side of the former bed of Presbury Street, 66 feet wide, and running thence binding on the south side of the former bed of said Presbury Street, Westerly 115.0 feet, more or

less, to the westernmost extremity of the former bed of said Presbury Street, there situate, the westernmost extremity of the former bed of Presbury Street, 66 feet wide, as condemned and closed under Ordinance No. 1203, approved December 2, 1967 by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore; thence binding on the westernmost extremity of the former bed of said Presbury Street, mentioned firstly herein, Northerly 66.0 feet to intersect the north side of the former bed of said Presbury Street, mentioned firstly herein; thence binding on the north side of the former bed of said Presbury Street, mentioned firstly herein, Easterly 115.0 feet, more or less, to intersect the west side of the former bed of said Thomas Avenue, and thence binding on the west side of the former bed of said Thomas Avenue, Southerly 66.0 feet to the place of beginning.

Beginning for Parcel No. 3 at the point formed by the intersection of the south side of North Avenue, 100 feet wide, and the east side of the former bed of Whitmore Avenue, 66 feet wide, and running thence binding on the east side of the former bed of said Whitmore Avenue, Southerly 100.0 feet, more or less, to the southernmost extremity of the former bed of said Whitmore Avenue, there situate, the southernmost extremity of the former bed of said Whitmore Avenue, as condemned and closed under Ordinance No. 559, approved November 26, 2007 by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore; thence binding on the southernmost extremity of the former bed of said Whitmore Avenue, mentioned firstly herein, Westerly 66.0 feet to intersect the west side of the former bed of said Whitmore Avenue, mentioned firstly herein; thence binding on the west side of the former bed of said Whitmore Avenue, mentioned firstly herein, Northerly 100.0 feet, more or less, to intersect the south side of said North Avenue, and thence binding on the south side of said North Avenue, Easterly 66.0 feet to the place of beginning.

Beginning for Parcel No. 4 at the point formed by the intersection of the north side of the former bed of Presbury Street, 20 feet wide, and the west side of Warwick Avenue, 66 feet wide, and running thence binding on the west side of said Warwick Avenue, Southerly 20.0 feet to intersect the south side of the former bed of said Presbury Street, Westerly 80.0 feet, more or less; thence binding on the south side of the former bed of said Presbury Street, Northerly 10.0 feet, more or less, to intersect the centerline of the former bed of said Presbury Street; thence binding on the centerline of the former bed of said Presbury Street; thence binding on the centerline of the former bed of said Presbury Street, Westerly 30.0 feet, more or less, to intersect the east side of the former bed of a 10-foot alley, laid out in the rear of the properties known as Nos. 1601 through 1733 Thomas Avenue; thence binding on the east side of the former bed of said 10-foot alley, Northerly 10.0 feet to intersect the north side of the former bed of said Presbury Street, and thence binding on the north side of the former bed of said Presbury Street, Easterly 110.0 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning.

Subject to full width Perpetual Easements for all Municipal Utilities and Services, not to be abandoned, over the entire hereinabove described parcels of land.

The parcels of land being no longer needed for public use.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no deed may pass under this Ordinance unless the deed has been approved by the City Solicitor.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.

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
