CITY OF BALTIMORE COUNCIL BILL

A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE concerning General Fund Appropriation Transfer - Department of General Services (Service 731) to State's Attorney (Service 115) - \$160,000

FOR the purpose of transferring a General Fund Appropriation in the amount of \$160,000 from the Department of General Services (Service 731: Facilities Management) to the State's Attorney (Service 115: Prosecution of Criminals); and providing for a special effective date.

BY authority of Article VI - Board of Estimates Section 9(a)(2) Baltimore City Charter (1996 Edition)

Recitals

Article VI, § 9(a)(2) of the City Charter provides that, on recommendation of the Board of Estimates, the City Council by ordinance may authorize the transfer of an appropriation contained in the Ordinance of Estimates from one municipal agency to another municipal agency.

The sum of \$160,000, as appropriated to the Department of General Services (Service 731: Facilities Management) in the Fiscal 2014 Ordinance of Estimates, is not needed for the purpose for which it was appropriated and, therefore, is available for transfer to another agency.

On September 25, 2013, the Board of Estimates recommended the transfer authorized by this Ordinance.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the sum of \$160,000, contained in the Fiscal 2014 Ordinance of Estimates as a General Fund Appropriation, is transferred from the Department of General Services (Service 731: Facilities Management) to the State's Attorney (Service 115: Prosecution of Criminals).

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
