CITY OF BALTIMORE COUNCIL BILL

A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE concerning

Trespass Towing - Maximum Fee Per Tow

FOR the purpose of setting the maximum fee that can be charged per tow by a trespass tow operator; and generally relating to trespass towing.

BY repealing and reordaining, with amendments Article 15 - Licensing and Regulation Section(s) 22-8 Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000)

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 15. Licensing and Regulation

Subtitle 22. Towing Services - Trespass Towing

§ 228. Charges.

- (a) Schedule to be filed.
- (1) Every person engaged in providing towing services shall, at the time of application for a license, file with the Board a schedule setting forth the applicant's proposed charges for towing and for any services incident to towing.

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- (2) The charges shall be stated clearly on the application for a towing services license filed by the person engaged in the towing business.
 - (b) Permitted basis.

The charges may be measured by mileage, time, and type of service or may be measured on a flat fee basis.

(C) MAXIMUM CHARGE.

NO MATTER HOW CALCULATED, THE TOTAL CHARGES MAY NOT EXCEED THE AMOUNT OF \$250 PER TOW.

[(c)] (D) Changes.

These charges shall not be changed without filing with the Board an amended schedule showing the charges proposed.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after the date it is enacted.

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
