A BILL ENTITLED

BY adding

Article 6 - Historical and Architectural Preservation Section(s) 13-36 Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000)

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:
