City of Baltimore Council Bill

A Bill Entitled

An Ordinance concerning

General Fund Operating Appropriation Transfer - M-R: Employees' Retirement Contribution (Service 355) to Fire Department (Service 600) - \$4,109,177

For the purpose of transferring a General Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$4,109,177 from M-R: Employees' Retirement Contribution (Service 355 - Employees' Retirement Contribution) to the Fire Department (Service 600 - Administration); and providing for a special effective date.

Recitals

Article VI, § 9(a)(2) of the City Charter provides that, on recommendation of the Board of Estimates, the City Council by ordinance may authorize the transfer of an appropriation contained in the Ordinance of Estimates from one municipal agency to another municipal agency.

The sum of \$4,109,177, as appropriated to the MR: Employees' Retirement Contribution (Service 355 - Employees' Retirement Contribution) in the Fiscal 2017 Ordinance of Estimates, is not needed for the purpose for which it was appropriated and, therefore, is available for transfer to another agency.

On December 21, 2016, the Board of Estimates recommended the transfer authorized by this Ordinance.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the sum of \$4,109,177, contained in the Fiscal 2017 Ordinance of Estimates as a General Fund Operating Appropriation, is transferred from M-R: Employees' Retirement Contribution (Service 355 - Employees' Retirement Contribution) to the Fire Department (Service 600 - Administration).

Section 2. And be it further ordained, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
