An Ordinance concerning

Howard Street Commercial Historic District

For the purpose of designating the area located within certain boundaries as the Howard Street Commercial Historic District.

By adding

Article 6 - Historical and Architectural Preservation Section(s) 7-37
Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000)

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 6. Historical and Architectural Preservation

Subtitle 7. Preservation Districts

§ 7-37. Howard Street Commercial Historic District.

The area located within the following boundaries is declared to be the Howard Street Commercial Historic District.

Beginning at the intersection of West Franklin Street and State Street; then from the point of beginning binding on the centerline of West Franklin Street easterly for approximately 607 feet to intersect the centerline of Park Avenue; then binding on the centerline of Park Avenue southerly approximately 360 feet to intersect the centerline of West Mulberry Street; then binding to the centerline of West Mulberry Street westerly for approximately

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605 feet to the centerline of State Street; then

binding on the centerline of State Street northerly for approximately 360 feet to the point of beginning.

Section 2. And be it further ordained, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

Section 3. And be it further ordained, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after the date it is enacted.
