## City of Baltimore Council Bill

#### A Bill Entitled

An Ordinance concerning

### Supplementary State Fund Operating Appropriation - Health Department - \$465,000

For the purpose of providing a Supplementary State Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$465,000 to the Health Department - Service 303 (Clinical Services), to provide funding for the development of the Sexual Health and Wellness Center that will house Ryan White, STI, and other programs, which provide early intervention services to individuals and families living in Baltimore with, affected by, or at high risk of HIV infection; and providing for a special effective date.

#### Recitals

The revenue appropriated by this Ordinance represents a grant from the Maryland Department of Health in excess of the revenue relied on by the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the budget for Fiscal Year 2018.

That grant could not have been expected with reasonable certainty when the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2018 was formulated.

On April 4, 2018, the Board of Estimates recommended this appropriation to the City Council.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That \$465,000 shall be made available to the Health Department - Service 303 (Clinical Services) as a Supplementary State Fund Operating Appropriation for Fiscal Year 2018, to provide funding for the development of the Sexual Health and Wellness Center that will house Ryan White, STI, and other programs, which provide early intervention services to individuals and families living in Baltimore with, affected by, or at high risk of HIV infection. The source of revenue for this appropriation is a grant from the Maryland Department of Health in excess of the amount from this source that was relied on by the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the budget for Fiscal Year 2018.
