#### **Community Relations - Redefining “Employer”**

For the purpose of redefining “employer” for purposes of the laws governing unlawful employment practices.

By repealing and reordaining, with amendments

**Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,** That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

#### **Baltimore City Code**

#### **Article 4. Community Relations**

#### **Subtitle 1. Definitions**

#### **§ 1-1. Definitions.**

##### **(i) *Employer.***

- (1) “Employer” means every person, other than fraternal and religious organizations, who employs [15] 1 or more persons, exclusive of parents, spouse, or children of [such] that person, during at least 15 days in the preceding 12 months.
- (2) “Employer” includes any governmental unit, agency, or employer as to which the City has the power to legislate.

**Section 2. And be it further ordained,** That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and

may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

**Section 3. And be it further ordained,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day after the date it is enacted.
