A Bill Entitled

An Ordinance concerning

Open-Space Zoning Districts - Tree Canopy Preservation

For the purpose of requiring the approval of the Forestry Division of the Department of Recreation and Parks prior to any tree removal on certain properties within a Baltimore City Open-Space Zoning District; and providing for a special effective date.

By adding

Article 32 - Zoning Section 7-204(h) Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000)

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 32. Zoning

Title 7. Open-Space and Environmental Districts

Subtitle 2
Open-space Zoning Districts

§ 7-204. Other applicable standards.

- (h) Tree canopy preservation.
 - (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subtitle, a tree may not be removed from a privately-owned property within an Open-Space Zoning District without the approval of the Forestry Division of the Department of Recreation and Parks.

- (2) The Forestry Division may only approve of the removal of a healthy tree under this subsection if the Division finds that the removal would not significantly affect the City's tree canopy.
- **Section 2.** And be it further ordained, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

Section 3. And be it further ordained, That this Ordinance takes effect when it is enacted.
