**Ethics Board - Administration and Staff**

For the purpose of appointing the Inspector General to serve as the Executive Director of the Board of Ethics; requiring that the Office of the Inspector General provide staff to the Board of Ethics; and providing for a special effective date.

**Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,** That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

**Baltimore City Code**

**Article 8. Ethics**

**Subtitle 3. Administration**

***Part II. Staff and Other Assistance***

**§ 3-11. Executive Director and staff.**

(a) *Director.*

The [Director of Legislative Reference] Inspector General serves as the Executive Director of the Ethics Board and is responsible for assisting the Board in performing its responsibilities.

(b) *Staff.*

In consultation with the Board, the Executive Director may assign staff from the [Department of Legislative Reference] Office of the Inspector General to assist the Board and Executive Director.

**Section 2. And be it further ordained,** That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

**Section 3. And be it further ordained,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 180<sup>th</sup> day after the date it is enacted.
