An Ordinance concerning

**Local 911 Telephone Fee - Revision** 

For the purpose of revising the local 911 telephone fee; and providing for a special effective date.

By repealing and re-ordaining, with amendments Article 28 - Taxes Section 26-1 Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000)

**Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore**, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

#### **Baltimore City Code**

#### Article 28. Taxes

### Subtitle 26. 911 Telephone Fee

#### § 26-1. Fee imposed.

In accordance with State Public Safety Article § 1-311, an additional charge of  $[75\phi]$  \$1 per month is levied and imposed on all current bills rendered for switched local exchange access service, wireless telephone service, or other 911-accessible service within Baltimore City.

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**Section 2.** And be it further ordained, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

Section 3. And be it further ordained, That this Ordinance takes effect on July 1, 2021.
