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
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Overview: ARPA Expenditures

\$641.1M Obligated 100% of ARPA funding has been obligated through March 31, 2025


\$434.9M Expended

68% of ARPA funding has been expended through March 31, 2025

Note: For purposes of reporting to the U.S. Treasury, obligations are calculated using a combination of all payroll and non-contractual expenses to date, the amount of funding committed to external parties by contract or grant, interagency agreements, and Treasury-defined estimates for administrative costs and personnel costs; Expended means the total amount of funds spent as of the end of the reporting period.





Opioid Restitution Fund Named Entities







The Recovery Office and the Baltimore City Mayor's Office of Overdose Response (BCMOOR) are collaborating to review and provide feedback on grant applications being prepared by the 22 entities named in legal settlements with pharmaceutical manufacturers and distributors. **To the extent possible, based on the capacity and stated preference of each named entity**, the goal is to have grant agreements signed by the Recovery Office and each named entity by July 1, 2025. Signed grant agreements will be submitted to the Board of Estimates soon thereafter.


