American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

Sponsor: Councilmember McCray, et al

Introduced: January 13, 2025

Purpose:

For the purpose of calling for quarterly financial oversight hearings regarding the management, disbursement and status of \$641 million in federal funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State and Local Fiscal Relief Funds to the City of Baltimore.

Analysis

Current Law

Baltimore City Code – Article 1, Subtitle 1-City Council, 1-6

§ 1-6. Agencies to provide legislative information.

It shall be the duty of the head of every City department or bureau established by the Baltimore City Charter or by ordinance to provide all technical materials, plats, drawings, and information that are requested by any member or the President of the City Council for the purpose of introducing legislation into the Council.

(City Code, 1976/83, art. 1, §6.) (Ord. 76-080.)



BACKGROUND

This memorandum accompanies the City of Baltimore Mayor's Office of Recovery Program's submission of its monthly report to the City Council on spending and performance related to American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding. Specifically, Council Bill 21-0121 § 49-2(B) prescribes the elements of legislatively required reporting, which stipulates that monthly reports should:

1. Provide data and metrics regarding how the funds have:
 - I. Increased the effectiveness of city government services;
 - II. Broadened the reach of city government services;
 - III. Made city government services more efficient;
 - IV. Made city government services more sustainable

2. Identify key performance indicators, benchmarks, and targets related to:
 - I. Equity, as defined in Article 1, § 39-1 of the Baltimore City Code;
 - II. Population Growth;
 - III. Labor and Employment;
 - IV. Economic Growth, especially the growth of minority and women-owned businesses; and,
 - V. Community Benefit

COMMITMENTS AND EXPENDITURES

As of December 31, 2024, the Mayor's Office of Recovery Programs committed \$641.1 million in ARPA funds to City agencies, quasi-governmental organizations, and nonprofits to advance priority initiatives for Baltimore City residents. Through February 2025, \$420.5 million had been spent on ARPA-funded projects (See Table 1), accounting for 65.6% of the current commitments and the City's \$641M total ARPA allocation.

Commitments

Table 1 lists ARPA commitments totaling \$641,170,126 and expenditures totaling \$420,514,197 through February 2025.

Note: Commitment and expenditure data are through February 2025. Expenditure data reflect transactions in Workday at the time of month-end close. Corrections to expenditures due to accounting adjustments, payroll errors, or other changes may occur prior to the end of the fiscal year.

Recovery Office Accomplishments

The Mayor's Office of Recovery Programs awarded ARPA funding to 46 nonprofit organizations. As of February 2025, all 46 nonprofits have received disbursements totaling \$37.7 million. See Table 1 for total disbursements. In addition, some highlights of select nonprofit activities in February are as follows:

- The **Leadenhall Baptist Church** is nearly done stabilizing and refurbishing its property as a food distribution site for the Sharp-Leadenhall Community. In addition to funding the new building, the ARPA-funded Pantry Project has provided critical food assistance to 932 households.
- **Parity x SOS Fund and the Pro Bono Resource Center**, along with other non-ARPA funded partners, will be collaborating to offer several free legal clinics to provide tax sale and property tax-related assistance to Baltimore City residents. Clinics include one on Tuesday, April 1, 2025, from 4 pm-7 pm at the Southeast Anchor Library, one on Saturday, April 5, 2025, from 10 am-2 pm at the Middle Branch Fitness and Rec Center, and one on Wednesday, April 9, 2025, from 10 am-2 pm at the Bon Secours Community Resource Center.
- **Southeast CDC (SECDC)** is rehabilitating formerly vacant homes for affordable homeownership in Ellwood Park and McElderry Park in SE Baltimore. Nine homes have been sold to buyers, all below 120% AMI, and some homes have been sold to homeowners below 50% AMI. Additionally, three homes are under contract, and another ten are under construction. SECDC has also completed 18 home repairs, with another eight underway in Ellwood Park.

In addition, the Recovery Office continues to provide technical assistance to all funded City agencies, quasi-government agencies, and nonprofits and coordinates with centralized functions such as legal, procurement, and finance to facilitate timely disbursements and expenditures.

City Agency Accomplishments

BALTIMORE CITY RECREATION AND PARKS (BCRP)

POOLS

Towanda and Coldstream Pools continue to progress and will be completed this Spring. They will be operational for Summer 2025. The Greater Model Pool is also progressing but will not be completed until late Summer 2025. It will not open until Summer 2026.

RECREATION CENTERS

The foundational work at the Gardenville Recreation Center is complete, and contractors are progressing with wall construction. All utility issues have been resolved. The project is tracking for completion in Q1 of 2026. Bocek Gym and Elijah Cummings Recreation Center have been awarded and are in the final stages of permitting and coordination with the contractors. A groundbreaking ceremony for the Bocek Recreation Center in East Baltimore was held on Monday, February 24, 2025. Both projects should be started by mid-March 2025.

PLAYGROUNDS

All projects have been completed except for De-wees Park, which is scheduled for Spring 2025.

ATHLETIC COURTS

All eight projects have been completed.

TRAILS

Gwynns Falls Trail signage is in fabrication. Coordination meetings with the installer have been held, and installation will begin in late March 2025.

BALTIMORE CITY HEALTH DEPARTMENT (BCHD)

FOOD INSECURITY

Eating Together in Baltimore: The \$1 million award for the congregate meal program will go through BOE on Thursday, March 19, 2025. The vendor, Dutch Mills Catering, plans to begin service on Thursday, May 1, 2025, to allow some lead time once the award is confirmed and public.

SNAP Outreach: BCHD is working with the Food Policy team to promote their Bmore Fresh on-line Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and get more folks signed up for SNAP. The BCHD team holds informational sessions about SNAP and the Bmore Fresh program at several senior centers. BCHD is finalizing a few more sessions at additional sites for the spring now that the weather is warmer and is anticipating more participants coming out to centers.

VACCINATION

From Saturday, February 1, until Friday, February 28, 2025, the VALUE (Vaccine Acceptance & Access Lives in Unity, Education & Engagement) Communities (VC) team has completed 34 COVID-19-related engagement events in senior residences (assisted living facilities, senior apartments), resource centers, churches, schools, Judy centers, markets, community centers, and recreation centers. The types of outreach activities include tabling at caregivers' support groups, family nights' support events, kids' support events, school/parents' breakfast, black families' wellness expo, wellness walks, school & family community council meetings, STEM festivals, school lunchtime and dismissals, resource fairs, food and diaper distribution events, school & science nights, and clinics. During March, the VC team has planned 39 more similar activities, totaling 73 engagement events for February and March 2025. Work consists of talking to Baltimore City's most vulnerable residents about the COVID-19 landscape and the importance of testing and vaccination. BCHD educates citizens not only about immunizations but also about the importance of early disease prevention and in this capacity, BCHD provides resources about obesity, diabetes, high blood pressure and other cardiovas-

cular diseases, cholesterol tests, children's checks (milestones), infant safe sleep, breastfeeding, cancer screenings (breast, prostate, skin, colon, and lung cancer), counseling (coping with stress, treating depression, reducing alcohol use, quitting smoking and drugs, eating healthfully, exercising, losing weight), sexual health, infectious diseases, dental services, and how to obtain medical insurance. To alleviate conditions caused by social determinants of health, BCHD also links clients to employment, safety, housing, utilities, and nutritional food services.

BALTIMORE CITY INFORMATION & TECHNOLOGY (BCIT)

Over the past month, the technical team has made significant progress on public Wi-Fi deployments. The rollout of the FreeBMoreWiFi network has been completed at the 8th senior center, completing all in-scope senior centers. Additionally, BCIT is working on a new feature to extend FreeBMoreWiFi over a Cellular network (Verizon Wireless) for mobility support and on-demand Wi-Fi access.

BCIT-BDE continues to engage in community outreach initiatives, including participation in the Maryland Digital Opportunity Day on Thursday, February 13, 2025. This event provided an opportunity to connect with various legislators and partners to discuss strategies for supporting ongoing efforts in digital equity initiatives.

BCIT is preparing for its virtual Digital Inclusion Advisory Board (DIAB) meeting on Thursday, March 13, 2025. This session will highlight women-led policies and programs in Baltimore City, featuring guest speaker Lil Trotman from Rebuild Johnston Square Neighborhood Organization, a Digital Equity Fund (DEF) Cycle One grantee, who will provide insights on the work the DIAB has achieved in advancing digital equity in Baltimore.

In February 2025, BCIT-BDE held one community meeting, engaged with five businesses, and connected with thirty-four residents. These efforts strengthen partnerships and enhance digital inclusion throughout the City.

The DEF Round Two grant cycle is underway, and BCIT-BDE is seeing significant progress in the digital skills and education programs associated with these grants. Each project actively engages participants by offering training and resources to improve their digital literacy and competencies.

HARDWARE REFRESH

The PC refresh initiative is progressing, with over 980 devices refreshed, including 71 in February 2025. BCIT has successfully met its goal of updating 51 CitiWatch cameras and has refreshed over 130 switches out of 343. As of February 2025, 17 hybrid meeting rooms have been outfitted, and seven mobile solutions have been deployed, including one spare.

MAYOR'S OFFICE OF HOMELESS SERVICES (MOHS)

HOUSING ACCELERATOR FUND

During February, the Corporation of Supportive Housing (CSH) held technical assistance calls with developers participating in the Housing Accelerator Program (HAP), including four emerging BIPOC or women-led organizations. Technical assistance focused on service provider identification and recruitment, identifying sources to close capital gaps, and obtaining site control.

Homes for America, a Housing Accelerator Fund (HAF) grantee, has begun project implementation and has participated in two monitoring meetings thus far. The organization has requested the first disbursement of funding to assist in creating five PSH units and 48 affordable housing units. A timeline for completion will be provided to MOHS in their next meeting.

HOUSING NAVIGATION AND LANDLORD INCENTIVES

In February 2025, the Landlord Incentive Fund paid one landlord signing bonus equaling \$3,000.00. There have been no mitigations funds paid to date. The Landlord Incentive Fund has expended \$59,000.00 of the \$1 million (minus the 10% United

Way admin fee), providing incentive bonuses to 28 units listed in the Padmission platform.

RAPID RESOLUTION AND SHELTER DIVERSION

MOHS has paid a total of \$1,523,312.78 to 353 households to date. The final reporting for the Flex Fund will be provided for March 2025. The project will then be closed.

MOHS is hiring two Shelter Diversion Case Workers and working on selecting a Shelter Diversion Program training partner.

SHELTER OPERATIONS AND ACQUISITION

MOHS continues to use ARPA funds to support operations at three shelters – the two hotels that the City purchased with ARPA funding and a third hotel now serving as a family shelter.

SHELTER DEMOBILIZATION

The rapid rehousing portion of the Shelter Demobilization grant has been fully expended. The subgrant to the Housing Authority of Baltimore City (HABC) has been fully expended. The permanent supportive housing (PSH) units developed through that subgrant are now available.

This grant also funds the renovation of affordable housing units at Restoration Gardens for youth transitioning out of foster care. Homes for America is the partner for this work. Two monitoring meetings have occurred. Homes for America has requested the first 20% draw and is soliciting bids. They report that they are on target to complete the project within the contracted time allotted.

Finally, MOHS has subgranted funds to Springboard Collaborative to develop transitional housing units for young adults experiencing homelessness or housing instability. The first monitoring meeting has occurred, and a second is scheduled for February 2025. Springboard has submitted 1 million dollars in reimbursable costs for payment. Currently, the project is on target.

MAYOR'S OFFICE OF NEIGHBORHOOD SAFETY AND ENGAGEMENT (MONSE)

COMMUNITY VIOLENCE INTERVENTIONS (CVI)

The CVI lane held an Information Session on Shooting Responses to level set expectations and procedures, work to change operational norms for how MONSE works, and better align with the Safe Streets Baltimore model.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & OPPORTUNITY (CE&O)

The Peace Mobile has 12 events scheduled for March.

GROUP VIOLENCE REDUCTION STRATEGY (GVRS)

There was a successful GVRS law enforcement takedown in Curtis Bay, the Southern District, which proved to be a test case for government and community partnership. The GVRS team has engaged BCHD, the Overdose Response ED, and public health providers who are playing a role in supporting the impacted community with overdose prevention resources, treatment, and harm reduction.

The GVRS team has increased monitoring of Roca to conform with its YAP reporting guidelines, including weekly updates in its SPM report. MONSE is now also including the overdose response following law enforcement actions in the City's OverdoseStat.

MONSE has weekly meetings with community moral voice partners at its Coordination Meeting.

MONSE has presented on GVRS at numerous community events in the past two weeks, such as the Curtis Bay and Pigtown town halls. MONSE will have a planning session with Curtis Bay community members to discuss its stabilization response to build community capacity over time.

VICTIM SERVICES

The ROAR center rallied to Annapolis for the Maryland 2025 legislative session with other safety support organizations to advocate for several laws being presented on behalf of victim supporters. The PAAVE center has their monthly survivor of homicide group on Thursday, March 14, 2025. Let's Thrive Baltimore is doing a Family Digital Literacy Hub Program in Gilmore Homes Recreation Center. Let's Thrive is also doing Phlebotomy/CNA/GNA classes in partnership with Renaissance Academy.

MAYOR'S OFFICE OF IMMIGRANT AFFAIRS (MIMA)

BALTIMORE NEW AMERICANS ACCESS COALITION (BNAAC)

BNAAC has enrolled 48 new cases since lifting the enrollment pause on October 1, 2024. Esperanza Center has enrolled 43 new cases. Global Refuge Welcome Center (GRWC) has enrolled five new cases. MIMA continues to provide referrals to implementing partners for outreach and engagement to meet enrollment targets. Global Refuge Technical Assistance (GRTA) has been meeting with Benefit Navigators weekly to share any relevant updates that could impact BNAAC operations and discuss challenges that Benefit Navigators are experiencing on the ground. GRTA held a "Know Your Rights" (KYR) conversation in February. This conversation confirmed that CBOs have internal policies dictating procedures when interacting with ICE or Law Enforcement and are reviewing these policies with BNAAC staff. Esperanza Center reports successfully distributing 15 award cards, promoting BNAAC through word of mouth and cold calls, and increasing BNAAC enrollment and interest. GRWC reported that MIMA's referral list yields more eligible BNAAC clients. Additionally, GRWC reported success in resolving a challenging SNAP case with the assistance of MIMA, local Department of Social Services (DSS) management staff, and the Department of Human Services (DHS) ombudsman.

Digital advertising via Somos Baltimore Latino's Facebook page garnered 276 referral submissions

over 4 weeks in February. MIMA continues conducting preliminary screenings to avoid duplicate enrollments before forwarding referrals to implementing partners Global Refuge Welcome Center and Esperanza Center. In addition, the BNAAC Program Engagement Associate participated in the John Ruhrah EMA Resource Fair on Thursday, February 20, 2025, and the Latino Providers Network Lunch on Monday, February 24, 2025. At these events, BNAAC was discussed, and BNAAC promotional flyers and materials were distributed. The Associate also distributed promotional flyers and materials to select referral partners to encourage continuing referrals. The Associate is coordinating Spring events to provide additional resources to current and previous BNAAC clients and reach potential BNAAC clients before the enrollment deadline.

LANGUAGE ACCESS

In February, 71 Baltimore City employees completed Language Access training on Workday, with completions by staff from BCFD, BCHD, MOHS, the Department of Finance, and MOCFS. MIMA continues to monitor and track staff training monthly. At the beginning of February 2025, Katie Miller was onboarded as the new Language Access Project Manager, filling the position vacated by Agatha So in January. MIMA also launched the 2025 cohort of agencies in February, with representatives of BCRP, BDC, BMZA, Baltimore City Council, DPW, ECB, MOEM, and MOHS attending initial onboarding meetings. MIMA will also work to onboard DCHD in March. As a next step, MIMA schedules recurring one-on-one check-ins with each agency to provide tailored technical assistance and implementation oversight. The cohort is prioritizing the identification of vital documents to ensure responsible and timely use of remaining ARPA funds allocated towards translation, and in March at the next cohort meeting, MIMA will provide guidance on completing the four-factor analysis and language access plan template. The first Language Access Oversight Committee (LAOC) meeting was held in February, with participation from 7 of the 10 members. Given the presence of new members, the meeting focused on orientation and project progress.

MIMA held the first LAOC meeting in February, and MIMA will begin to distribute 311 Know Your Rights flyers at community events in April.

DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (DHCD)

PARK HEIGHTS SENIOR AND MULTI-FAMILY HOUSING

Stakeholders participated in a Hard Hat Tour that showcased newly created affordable housing for seniors in the Park Heights Community. The tour highlighted unique amenities such as a comprehensive solar array that covers the rooftop, carports, and a green area pergola, effectively generating enough power to nearly eliminate common area electricity usage. The system is complemented by a robust battery backup capable of powering essential systems, such as HVAC, lighting, Wi-Fi, and security, for up to 18 hours with only a 2-hour recharge time.

NHP Foundation, the Park Heights Senior and Multi-family Housing project developer, has begun branding the 17 acres. The branding firm that NHP engaged with is working with the community to collaborate on branding decisions, such as the naming of the neighborhood. A tentative ribbon cutting date is scheduled for the senior housing on Saturday, May 10, 2025.

DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING (DOP)

MIDDLE NEIGHBORHOODS CDC

Healthy Neighborhoods, Inc. (HNI) was invited to a town hall with Senator Attar, representing the 41st district in the Maryland Senate. At this meeting, HNI had the opportunity to discuss home preservation for residents of the Edmondson Corridor. Senator Attar encouraged HNI to develop a concrete request for funding support from the Senate. HNI promptly drafted a bond bill, requesting \$300,000 for home repair and estate planning costs to support “Legacy” residents of the eastside Edmondson Avenue communities designated as Middle

Neighborhoods (Allendale, Edgewood, Edmondson Village). In February, HNI attended the Resident Market Leader meeting in Belair-Edison, which focused on new residents and inspired them to get involved and possibly become Block Ambassadors.

CLEAN CORPS

In February 2025, Clean Corps officially launched the Regional Strategy, expanding from 24 to 42 active neighborhoods. Teams are now responsible for selections across 2-3 neighborhoods each. This month has been an adjustment period with new staff and supervisors coming on board and teams getting used to working over much larger areas. The new selections for these neighborhoods have not been finalized yet, so while that is in process, Clean Corps has prioritized community requests for bulk item collection, overflowing trashcans, unmaintained tree pits, and other services not captured in the performance measures. Clean Corps completed 470 such services, in addition to the 270 alley services and 218 vacant lot services reported during February.

FOOD INSECURITY

The Food Insecurity team visited the Good Samaritan location for the Produce Rx pillar of its ARPA allocation. The team could see firsthand the meals and services that patients receive because of ARPA funding. Over the next month, visits will be made to other partners for other pillars, including the Black Butterfly Teaching Farm, to observe the partnership between the farm and The Common Market, which provides fresh produce to residents for the Produce Box Distribution pillar.

DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES (DGS)

BALTIMORE POLICE DEPARTMENT (BPD) FLEET

DGS has received all 100 BPD Police Interceptor Utilities (PIUs) ordered using ARPA funds. Of the vehicles received, 33 are currently being upfitted, one is at the dealer for warranty repair, and 66 are now in service.

HVAC IMPROVEMENTS AT CITY LIBRARIES

Design work is underway for the six library branches receiving HVAC repair and replacement. Construction has begun at the Brooklyn and Northwood branches, with Brooklyn scheduled for completion in April 2025 and Northwood in June 2025. Construction for all six libraries is expected to conclude by October 2025.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Construction for the Northwest Community Action Center project is complete.

The City Hall roof contract was awarded on Wednesday, November 6, 2024, and the Notice to Proceed was issued on December 19, 2024. Construction is slated to begin in May 2025. The ARPA-funded portion of the contract will be completed before the expenditure deadline on Thursday, December 31, 2026.

DGS is also managing facility improvements at Baltimore City Fire Stations. These include roof replacements, bathroom renovations, and other facility upgrades. For the roof repair and replacements, construction is substantially complete on the Hazmat Fire Station, Engine 42, and Engine 45. The final BCFD facility roof was bid in early January 2025. For the bathroom renovations, work is nearly complete at Engine 45 and Engine 30. All additional bathroom renovations are slated to be completed by October 2025. The geothermal system at Truck 5 has been fully replaced, and the boiler at the Fire Academy has been removed. New generators will be installed in spring 2025 in four BCFD facilities.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS (DPW)

CAPITAL AND OPERATING IMPROVEMENTS

DPW will utilize ARPA funds for capital improvements at Bowley's Lane and operating improvements across the Department of Solid Waste. DPW is currently awaiting the delivery of temporary restroom facilities before construction can begin at Bowley's Lane. Operating improvements include

purchasing new technology and additional fleet. DPW has received tablets to use at residential drop-off facilities and signage and bins for the composting program. Five 8-yard load packers have been delivered and are in service, and seven 16-yard load packers have been delivered, with six now in service. All other additions to the fleet have been ordered, and spend will be reported as vehicles are delivered.

BALTIMORE CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT (BCFD)

BCFD is utilizing ARPA funding to acquire life-saving equipment strategically (for additional projects benefitting BCFD, please see DGS). The equipment includes self-contained breathing apparatuses, thermal imaging cameras, hose replacements, rain hoods, and other safety items and accessories. A portion of self-contained breathing apparatuses and thermal imaging cameras have been delivered, all expected by Spring 2025. Hoses have been ordered and will be fully delivered by November 2025. Rain hoods will be ordered in April 2025 and delivered in June 2025. Several other items have been delivered, including face masks, foam concentrate, and forcible entry tools.

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (DOT)

The Footway Reconstruction project has begun construction activity starting in March. March data will reflect these square foot totals.

Through February 2025, DOT contractors have reconstructed 448 ADA ramps, with 28 completed in the last month. DOT has met 32% of its performance target for this measure.

BALTIMORE CITY PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM (BCPSS)

Air Conditioning installation work at Northwestern High School is still paused. It is expected to resume in March 2025. The MerVo High School Turf Field Request for Proposal is under legal review. Proposals for City Springs design and Edmondson High School design have been evaluated and reviewed by all relevant committees. Designs are slated for approval by the School Board on Tuesday, April 8, 2025.

Performance Measures and Metrics

Table 3 includes a select number of performance measures. The Recovery Office will continue to coordinate with subrecipients on measure accuracy.
